
The mission of South Carolina Business Week is to contribute to the preparation of young adults for the business environment by introducing them to the principles of leadership, teamwork and the American free enterprise system while promoting self-reliance, individual responsibility and entrepreneurship.

South Carolina Business Week is a premier business education program for top-ranking high school students from across the state. During the week, twenty-four prominent business executives mentored the students and taught current business topics.

Fourteen executives remained with the students for the entire week, each managing a company team of students in an advisory capacity. Starting with the basics and adding topics throughout the week, students collaborated with executives in an intensive program designed to develop a thorough understanding of private enterprise. Students participated in a unique business simulation, Entrepreneur, provided by Interpretive Simulations.
