The Safety, Health and Security Committee of the South Carolina Chamber of Commerce will honor South Carolina Chamber members who had a successful safety record in 2009. This program is designed to recognize companies and their employees who have had a commendable Lost Workday Case Rate during the 2009 calendar year. For multi-location employers, each site is considered a separate establishment and there should be a separate application form for each location.

Also, if you achieved 1,000,000 safe work hours without a lost time accident during calendar year 2009, you might qualify for recognition from the South Carolina Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation. Please email Teresa Higgins at higginst@llr.sc.gov for more information on that program.
